#### THE MONTH OF ELUL

One of the major accusations often leveled at the CEO of the universe is inaccessibility. These charges are entirely unfounded. G-d is everywhere, and from there He awaits your call. And just to prove it, one month before Rosh Hashanah, He devotes an entire month to being as approachable as an Almighty Creator can get.

Think of it as though the big boss took a stroll through the cubicles, happily chatting with anyone who approaches, giving each his full attention and a warm smile. That is what our Sages mean when they call Elul the Month of Divine Compassion. During these days, you can repair all that went amiss from the entire year—with study, with charity and good deeds, with meditation and prayer. That is also why we blow the Shofar every day of this month (except Shabbat), as a wake-up call to prepare for the magnificent days to come. We also have our Mezuzot and Tefillin checked during this month.

#### ELUL 25

First day of Creation, according to one Talmudic opinion. Rosh Hashanah is the sixth day, when Man was created.

#### A Healthy, Happy and Prosperous New Year!

#### **TISHREI 1-2 | ROSH HASHANAH**

Rosh Hashanah ("Head of the Year"), the Jewish New Year, is celebrated as a two-day holiday. On these days the Heavenly Court decides all that is to happen to all beings during the coming year.

It is customary on Rosh Hashanah to eat foods symbolizing sweetness, blessings and abundance. We dip the challah in honey; and afterwards, on the first night of the holiday, Sept. 6, we eat a piece of apple dipped in honey. After the appropriate blessing on the apple, we add: "May it be Your will to renew for us a good and sweet year."

#### The Shofar

There is one mitzvah, the core mitzvah of this day, that sums up all that Rosh Hashanah is about. It is to hear the sound of a Shofar blown thirty times in the sequence written in the prayerbook. A Shofar is not a trumpet or a French horn; it is a plain horn of an animal. We don't play a symphony or a sonata, just a raw and simple cry. Our Sages say it is the sound of a small child crying for his father. If you listen carefully, you can hear that cry inside as well, a simple, primal cry as each soul yearns to return to its essential Father on this day. We hear the sounding of the Shofar on both days of Rosh Hashanah, Sept. 7 and 8, during the daytime.

#### Tashlich

A beautiful and ancient custom observed in most communities, full of symbolism and drama. On the first day of Rosh Hashanah, Tuesday, Sept. 7, we walk to a body of water containing live fish and recite Tashlich, a prayer that G-d, out of His great compassion, will toss our sins into the sea. The fish, too, take part in the metaphor: just as fish never close their eyes, so is G-d ever-watchful over us.

#### TISHREI 3 | FAST OF GEDALIAH

Gedaliah was a righteous Jewish governor appointed by the Babylonian conquerors after they destroyed the First Temple. When he was assassinated (422 BCE), our people's plight hit an extreme low. This fast day commemorates this tragic event.

#### TISHREI 6

Yahrtzeit of Rebbetzin Chana Schneerson, mother of the Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson.

#### TISHREI 10 | YOM KIPPUR

Yom Kippur ("Day of Atonement") is the holiest day in the Jewish Year. So holy that the soul is "at one" with G-d. When you're at one, all is forgiven. There is a catch: Nothing must interfere with that oneness. That's why, from Wednesday evening, Sept. 15, until Thursday night, Sept. 16, in addition to the prohibition of work—just like on Shabbat—there are five other off-limits activities: Eating and drinking, anointing with perfumes or lotions, marital relations, washing (for pleasure) and wearing leather shoes.

#### TISHREI 15-21 | SUKKOT

Sukkot is a joyous holiday. For seven days we are once again the original people of Moses wandering in the wilderness, surrounded by the Clouds of Glory. Only now those clouds are the greenery of a festive hut called a Sukkah. All meals are eaten in the Sukkah, barring inclement weather.

#### THE FOUR SPECIES

There is another mitzvah unique to Sukkot: The Torah tells us to take an etrog (a Mediterranean citrus fruit), a lulav (palm branch), three hadassim (myrtle branches) and two aravot (willow branches), hold them together and shake them gently. We do this each day of the festival, excluding Shabbat.

This mitzvah is deep with meaning. The Four Species express the diversity of the Land of Israel, the diversity of human experience and the diversity of the Jewish People. All four corners of this diversity are needed to complete the mitzvah, and all four must be held together as one.



#### TISHREI 21 | HOSHANA RABBAH

On Hoshana Rabbah a verdict is issued Above: how much rain will descend this year, and where. As Earth's lawyers, we follow ancient customs to influence this decree. All the preceding night we recite the Book of Deuteronomy and the Book of Psalms. In the morning we circle the bimah (Torah reading platform) of the synagogue seven times, lulav and etrog in hand, while reciting the Hoshanot. Then, in an ancient rite of profound mystical significance, we beat five willow branches on the floor.

#### **TISHREI 22-23 | SIMCHAT TORAH**

On the evening of Simchat Torah (Tuesday, Sept. 28), and in some communities on the evening of Shemini Atzeret as well, we make seven hakafot (circlings) around the bimah, singing and dancing with the Torah scrolls. On the morning of Simchat Torah, Sept. 29, the final portion of the Torah is read, completing the yearly cycle. Then we immediately read the first portion, beginning the cycle anew.

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#### **TISHREI 29**

Shimon HaTzaddik ("the Righteous") passed away. He was the Kohen Gadol (high priest) and leader of the Jews for 40 years during the early period of the Second Temple in Jerusalem. During his time, Alexander the Great conquered the Land of Israel (c. 313 BCE).

#### **CHESHVAN 7**

At the time of the Holy Temple the economy of Israel was dependent on rainfall to make the crops grow. Nevertheless, out of their great love for one another, the Jews in Israel waited two full weeks after Sukkot, until Cheshvan 7, before requesting rain, rather than possibly inconvenience even the last few pilgrims on their return trip to the most distant boundary of the Holy Land.

#### **CHESHVAN 11**

Rachel, wife of Jacob, mother of Joseph and Benjamin, passed away (1563 BCE). She is buried outside Bethlehem.

#### **CHESHVAN 13**

Burning of the Talmud in Venice by order of the pope in 1553.

#### **CHESHVAN 20**

Birthday of Rabbi Sholom Dov-Ber (1860-1920), known as the Rebbe RaShaB, fifth leader of Chabad-Lubavitch.

#### **TEFILLIN AND THE MEZUZAH**

#### TEFILLIN

"You shall bind them as a sign upon your hand, and they shall be for a reminder between your eyes." —Deuteronomy  $6{:}8$ 

You have a brain. It is in one world. Your heart is in another. And your hands often end up involved in something completely foreign to both of them. Three diverse machines.

So you put on tefillin. First thing in the day, you connect your head, your heart and your hand with these leather straps—all to work as one, with one intent: a dedicated service of the Almighty. And then, when you go out to meet the world, all your actions find harmony in a single coordinated purpose.

Tefillin are a pair of black leather boxes containing Hebrew parchment scrolls. A set includes two tefillin—one for the head and one for the arm. Each consists of three main components: the scrolls, the box and the strap. The scrolls are inserted into boxes made of leather that have been painted black.

One box is strapped on your head, and the other onto your arm next to your heart. It's done once a day—preferably during the morning prayers. If that is not possible, say at least the passage called the Shema. It's done by Jewish males, age 13 and up, every day except Shabbat and major Jewish holidays.

#### THE MEZUZAH

Inside that small case nailed or glued at the entrance of a Jewish home is a miniature scroll, written with exquisite care by an expert scribe, containing the Shema Yisrael—the proclamation of a Jew's faith. The mezuzah is a covenant we have made with the Master of the Universe: We will inscribe His unity upon the doorposts of our homes, and He will protect us wherever we may be found.

It is a symbol for all that a Jew is meant to accomplish in this world for this entire cosmos is truly His home, lacking but the signature of the Artist at the entrance to each thing. We and our mitzvahs are meant to be His signature. And with this, the world finds stability and peace.

A mezuzah should be affixed to the doorpost of every room in the home and place of business, including the basement, attic and garage. We do not place one at the entrance to a bathroom. Each mezuzah should be examined by a reliable scribe at least twice every seven years. Before affixing a mezuzah to a doorpost, recite the following blessing:

Buh-rookh ah-tuh ah-doh-noi, eh-loh-hay-noo meh-lech huh-ohluhm, ah-shehr kee-deh-shuh-noo beh-mitz-voh-suhv, veh-tzee-vuhnoo lik-boh-ah meh-zoo-zuh.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the universe, Who has sanctified us with His commandments, and has commanded us to affix a mezuzah.

If more than one mezuzah is being affixed at one time, only one blessing is recited. When affixing a mezuzah to an entrance without a door, no blessing is recited.

The mezuzah is affixed:

A. On the right doorpost as one enters.

B. In a slanted position, with the top pointed to the inside of the room. C. In the upper third of the doorpost height. (If the doorway is very tall, place it at shoulder height.)

D. On the outer 3.2 inches of the width of the doorpost.

#### KISLEV 9

Birthday (1773) and yahrtzeit (1827) of Rabbi DovBer, known as the Mitteler Rebbe, second leader of Chabad-Lubavitch.

#### KISLEV 10

Release from imprisonment on false charges, in 1826, of Rabbi DovBer (1773–1827), second leader of Chabad-Lubavitch.

#### **KISLEV 14**

Wedding anniversary of the Lubavitcher Rebbe and Rebbetzin (1928).

#### **KISLEV 19**

Rabbi DovBer of Mezeritch, known as the Maggid of Mezeritch, passed away (1772). He was the chief disciple and successor of the Baal Shem Tov.

Release from czarist imprisonment in Petersburg (1798) of his youngest disciple, Rabbi Shneur Zalman of Liozhna (later of Liadi), known as the Alter Rebbe, founder of Chabad-Lubavitch, author of Tanya, Shulchan Aruch HaRav and other profound works. After disproving the false charges of his opponents, he so impressed the ministers and senators who judged him (and even the czar himself, who personally visited him) with his wisdom and saintliness, that the entire Chassidic movement was vindicated and could henceforth spread its teachings freely. Celebrated throughout the world as the "New Year of Chassidism."

#### **KISLEV 25-TEVET 2 | CHANUKAH**

"What is Chanukah?... When the Greeks entered the Sanctuary (in Jerusalem), they defiled all the oil (used for lighting the seven-branched menorah) there. When the rulers of the Hasmonean family overcame them and triumphed, they searched and found only one flask of oil remaining with the seal of the Kohen Gadol (high priest). It had only enough oil to light for one day. A miracle occurred to it, and they used it to light for eight days. The following year, they (the Sages) established it as a permanent holiday of praise and thanksgiving" (Talmud, Shabbat 21b). This occurred in the year 165 BCE.

Kislev 25 is also the anniversary (1313 BCE) of the completion of the temporary sanctuary (Mishkan) built by the Jewish People in the desert (Exodus 25–27, 30–31, 35–40). But it was not dedicated or erected for another three months. Instead, the day of Kislev 25 waited to become a holiday until the Hasmoneans rededicated the Temple from Greek defilement 1148 years later.

#### HOW TO CELEBRATE CHANUKAH

Kindle the Chanukah menorah on each of the eight nights of Chanukah. For the dates and times, see the calendar below. For the lights of the menorah, use olive oil or candles large enough to burn until at least half an hour after nightfall. Use a "shamash" (service candle) to kindle the lights, and place it in its special place on the menorah.

For the number of lights and the order of kindling, see the calendar below.

Before kindling recite the blessings, and after kindling recite "Haneiros Hallalu." See the calendar below for which blessings to say.

All members of the family should be present at the kindling of the Chanukah lights. Have all young boys kindle their own Chanukah menorahs, and all young girls light their own Shabbat candles. Students and singles who live in a dormitory or in their own apartments should kindle menorahs in their own rooms. Chanukah lights are kindled in the front window or by a doorway.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the universe, who has sanctified us with His commandments, and commanded us to kindle the Chanukah light.

2. Buh-rookh ah-tuh ah-doh-noi, eh-loh-hay-noo meh-lech huh-oh-luhm, sheh-uh-suh nee-sim lah-ah-voh-say-noo, bah-yuh-mim huh-haym biz-mahn hah-zeh.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the universe, who performed miracles for our forefathers in those days, at this time.

The following blessing is said only on the first evening (or the first time one kindles the lights this Chanukah):

3. Buh-rookh ah-tuh ah-doh-noi, eh-loh-hay-noo meh-lech huh-oh-luhm, sheh-heh-kheh-yuh-noo, veh-kee-yeh-muh-noo, veh-hee-gee-uh-noo liz-mahn hah-zeh.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the universe, who has granted us life, sustained us, and enabled us to reach this occasion.

#### **KISLEV 27**

Flood rains cease (2105 BCE) The forty days and nights of rainfall that started on Cheshvan 17, which covered the earth with water in Noah's time, ended on Kislev 27 of the year 1656 from creation. (The flood itself lasted a full year, as related in Genesis 6-8.)

#### **TEVET 8**

Anniversary of the Septuagint, translation of the Five Books of Moses into Greek by 72 Jewish Sages, by order of Ptolemy, King of Egypt (c. 250 BCE). Each sage was isolated from the others, but all miraculously produced an identical translation.

#### **TEVET 9**

Passing of Ezra the Scribe (313 BCE). Ezra led the return of the Jewish people to the land of Israel after the Babylonian exile (423-353 BCE). He oversaw the rebuilding of the Second Temple, canonized the 24 books of the Tanach (holy scriptures), and led the Men of the Great Assembly, who instituted many laws and practices, including formalized prayer.

#### **TEVET 10**

Anniversary of the start of the siege of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon (425 BCE), culminating in the destruction of the First Temple. Commemorated since then as a public fast day.

#### **TEVET 20**

RaMBaM (Maimonides), Rabbi Moshe ben Maimon (1135-1204), passed away in Cairo, Egypt, and was buried in Tiberias, Israel. Outstanding codifier, commentator, philosopher, physician to Sultan Saladin, and leader of Egyptian Jewry, his brilliant works are studied to this day. It was said of him: "From Moses to Moses (i.e., the RaMBaM), there was none like Moses!"

The Lubavitcher Rebbe has urged all Jews to study daily his Mishneh Torah (authoritative code of Jewish law), or at least the briefer Sefer HaMitzvos.

Printing of Talmud (1483)

The first volume of the Babylonian Talmud, tractate Berachot, was printed in Soncino, Italy, on the 20th of Tevet of the year 5244 from creation.

#### TEVET 24

Rabbi Shneur Zalman of Liadi, first leader of Chabad-Lubavitch, passed away in 1812.

#### THE SHABBAT

Shabbat (also known as "Shabbos" or the "Sabbath") is the centerpiece of Jewish life, and has been so since the infancy of our nation. According to the Talmud, Shabbat is equal to all the other commandments. Shabbat is so central to Jewish life that the term *shomer Shabbat* (Shabbat observer) is synonymous with "religious Jew" in common parlance.

Shabbat is a day of rest and celebration that begins on Friday at sunset and ends on the following evening after nightfall. Let's have a look at the history, importance and observances of this day.

Our sages tell us that the Shabbat is a "queen," whose regal presence graces every Jewish home for the duration of the Shabbat day. For this reason we wash ourselves, dress in our finest clothes and make sure our homes are in tip-top shape on Friday afternoon. According to the Talmud, we actually receive a special additional soul every Shabbat.

The prophet Isaiah foretells great delight that comes as a reward "if you restrain your foot because of the Sabbath, from performing your affairs on My holy day, and you call the Sabbath a delight, the holy of the L-rd honored, and you honor it by not doing your customary ways, by not pursuing your affairs and speaking words."


Shabbat is so special that even our choice of words and comportment, and the items that we touch must be consistent with this holy day. This includes the admonition not to handle items known as *muktzeh*, which have been set aside because they generally have no use within the Shabbat lifestyle.

#### SHABBAT CANDLES

The Torah enjoins us to "honor the Shabbat and call it a delight." Now, one element of this "delight" is to have candles lit. In addition to creating a bright and cheery ambiance, the candles ensure that we don't spend the evening stumbling around in the dark. The Torah clearly tells us that we may not kindle fire on Shabbat. So the key is to light the delight-giving candles before the onset of the day.

The Shabbat candles represent the light we introduce into the world through studying Torah and observing its precepts. And they also represent the additional soul that our sages say we are given on Shabbat.

#### THE SEFER TORAH

A Sefer Torah, or Torah Scroll, is a handwriten scroll with 304,805 letters, containing the Five Books of Moses. It is written by a scribe who is specially ordained to write, and its laws are meticulously detailed.

The final commandment of the Torah is to write one's own Sefer Torah. Today this is commonly done through buying a letter, chapter or portion in a joint Sefer Torah. Buying a letter in a joint Sefer Torah joins one together in unity with Jews throughout the world who have also obtained a letter in unity Torah scrolls.

#### TZEDAKA: FOR THE SAKE OF GIVING.

Rabbi Shimon Bar Yochai, Mishnaic Sage and author of the Zohar, principal work of Jewish mysticism (Kabbalah), showed up at the door of his nephews' home the day after Rosh Hashanah and began to lecture them about the importance of giving charity to the poor. Although they weren't wealthy, they listened to what their uncle had to say. "Give with an open hand," Rabbi Shimon adjured. "Don't worry about tomorrow; G-d will provide. And most important: Write down every penny that you give, and carry the list with you at all times. I want to see a big sum at the end of the year." Rabbi Shimon made them promise and he left.

Almost a year later they had another strange visit—from a group of Roman soldiers with an order for their arrest. Someone accused them of selling silk without paying the tax. Protesting their innocence and trembling with fear, they were led off to prison, where they were given a choice: either pay a large fine of six hundred dinar or produce an even more outrageously priced silk garment for the king, both of which were utterly beyond their means.

When Rabbi Shimon heard what had happened, he rushed to the prison to visit them. "Where is the account of the charity you gave?" he asked. They showed him that they had given almost six hundred dinar; they were just six dinar short. "Do you have any money with you?" he asked. They produced six dinar that they had sewn into their garments in case they needed it. Rabbi Shimon took the money, bribed one of the officials, the charges were dropped and they were released.

Rabbi Shimon explained to them what had happened. "This past Rosh Hashanah I dozed off and dreamed that the government would demand of you six hundred dinars. That is why I told you to give charity, to negate the decree." "Then why didn't you tell us that?" they complained. "We would have given the money immediately and spared ourselves a lot of anguish." "But then," replied Rabbi Shimon, "you wouldn't have done the mitzvah for its own sake." (From Midrash Rabbah, Vayikra 34:12)

#### **TEVET 28**

Shimon ben Shatach, brother of King Alexander Yannai's queen Salome, and president of the Sanhedrin (supreme religious and governing body of the Jews), succeeded in replacing its Sadducee members with faithful Torah Sages (c. 90 BCE). The day was celebrated as a holiday for many years.

#### SHEVAT 1

On this day Moses began telling the Jewish People the Book of Devarim (Deuteronomy 1:1), the fifth of the Five Books of Moses. It was his last will and testament before he passed away over a month later, and before they entered the land of Israel.

#### SHEVAT 10

Rabbi Shalom Sharabi, brilliant and saintly Yemenite Kabbalist, whose works are much revered, passed away (Jerusalem, 1777).

Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn (1880–1950), sixth leader of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement, passed away. He is renowned for his devoted efforts in strengthening Judaism in the USSR, the USA and many other lands. He brought the Chabad movement to America. A prolific writer, he is said to have written over 100,000 letters in his lifetime!

This day also marks the beginning of the leadership of his successor, the Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem M. Schneerson.

#### SHEVAT 15

New Year for trees, when the earliest-blooming trees begin to bud in Israel. It is customary to partake of fruits, especially those for which the Land of Israel is praised in Scripture.


The seven species of Israel are wheat, barley, grape (wine), fig, pomegranate, olive (oil), and date (honey). Many people have the custom of also eating carob on this day, while others eat jam or preserves from the etrog left over from Sukkot.

#### THE JEWISH CALENDAR

The Jewish calendar revolves around the moon. At the beginning of each month the moon appears as a thin curve. Over the next two weeks it grows daily. Once it hits its zenith in the middle of the month, it begins to diminish until it can no longer be seen. After two days of invisibility it reappears as a thin crescent, and the cycle begins anew.

The entire process takes 29.5 days. As a month must comprise full days, the months are sometimes 29 days (called *chaser* or "missing"), and sometimes 30 (*malei* or "full").

The Torah schedules the Jewish holidays according to the days of the month. The first day of the month, as well as the thirtieth day of a full month, is called Rosh Chodesh, the "Head of the Month." The day is treated as a mini-festival.

For many centuries Jewish rhythm and law were not governed by a set calendar. Rather, the month's duration would be determined by the Sanhedrin, the Jewish Supreme Council. Based on when the following month's new moon was sighted, an intricate process involving witnesses who could come from anywhere in the country, the Sanhedrin would determine the month's length.


It was in the 4th century CE that the sage Hillel II realized that change was necessary. Recognizing that the Sanhedrin would be dissolved, he and his rabbinical court established the fixed calendar in a 19-year cycle which is used to this day.

The Torah states, "Guard the month of spring, and make [then] the Passover offering." Passover, then, must be observed in the spring. To this end, the Jewish lunar calendar must synchronize with the seasons, which are regulated by the sun. While a lunar year is approximately 354.4 days, a solar year is eleven days longer. If no adjustment is made, Passover would occur eleven days earlier each year, shifting into winter, fall, summer, and then spring again. The solution is to add an extra (30-day) month into 7 of the 19 years, creating a 13-month year. This is called a *shanah meuberet* ("pregnant year") in Hebrew; in English we call it a leap year.

This month is added to the final month of the year, Adar, so that in leap years we observe two Adars. As Adar is traditionally the most joyous month, the extra Adar is a gift of more happiness in the year.

#### ADAR | 14-15

Known as Purim Katan ("Small Purim") and Shushan Purim Katan. Until about 1600 years ago (359 CE), when our present fixed calendar was established, the decision whether the year would be a leap year was left to the Sanhedrin (highest rabbinical court). They often postponed this decision until the last minute (adding the extra month, for example, if pilgrims traveling from far away to Jerusalem for Passover would otherwise be unable to arrive in time). So these days could indeed have been Purim and Shushan Purim, if not for this last-minute change. It is customary to celebrate these days as a minor holiday.

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### SHABBAT AND YOM TOV CANDLES

### HOLIDAY RECIPES

#### THE SHABBAT CANDLES

A married woman customarily lights two candles, and may add an additional one for each of her children. An unmarried girl should light only one candle, in deference to her mother.

As soon as a young girl can understand the idea of the Shabbat and can say the blessing (approximately 3 years old), her parents should provide her with a candlestick and teach her to kindle the Shabbat candles.

The young girl should light before her mother, in case she needs assistance from her.

It is customary to put a few coins into a tzedaka pushka (charity box) before lighting the candles.

The correct time to light the Shabbat candles is at least 18 minutes before sunset every Friday. Young girls should light just prior to this time.

#### THE FESTIVAL CANDLES

Just as candles are lit in honor of the Shabbat, so are they lit in honor of the festivals.

Various blessings are recited on different festivals. See the chart Blessings for Festival Candle-Lighting.

CAUTION: When lighting after the onset of a festival, a preexisting flame must be used to light the candles, since it is prohibited to create a new flame by striking a match, using a lighter, etc. However, it is permissible to use (or transfer fire from) a flame burning continuously since the onset of the festival, such as a pilot light, gas or candle flame.

#### PROCEDURE FOR LIGHTING THE SHABBAT CANDLES

The woman (or young girl) lights the candles, then spreads her hands out around the candles, drawing her hands inwards in a circular motion three times to indicate her acceptance of the sanctity of the Shabbat. She then covers her eyes and says the blessing:

Blessed are You, L-rd, our G-d, King of the universe, who has sanctified us with His commandments, and commanded us to kindle the light of the holy Shabbat.

She then uncovers her eyes to behold the Shabbat lights.

The time of lighting is considered an especially propitious time to pray to G-d for health and happiness. The prayer is readily accepted, because it is said during the performance of this great mitzvah of lighting the Shabbat candles.

CAUTION: The candles must be lit before sunset. It is prohibited - and is a desecration of the Shabbat - to light the candles after sunset.



#### TRADITIONAL CHALLAH

For an unusually smooth taste and texture to enhance your Shabbat and Yom Tov meals.

5 pounds flour 2 ounces fresh yeast and 1 package dry yeast 2 cups warm water 1½ sticks margarine 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cups boiling water 2 tbsp. salt 1½ cups sugar 5 eggs Glaze: 1 egg, beaten Poppy seeds



large bowl and pour boiling water over it, and stir until margarine is melted. Add salt and sugar. Let cool for a few minutes and beat in eggs. Add the bubbling yeast. Gradually add flour. Knead for 10 minutes. If dough is too moist, add a little more flour.

When ready to rise, smear top of dough with oil, cover and let rise 1 hour. Separate a small portion of dough known as 'challah' from the whole dough. Shape and let rise another hour. Brush with beaten egg to glaze. Sprinkle with poppy seeds.

Bake at 350° for 1 hour for large challahs, ½ hour for smaller challahs and rolls.

#### **HONEY CAKE**

Traditionally served on Rosh Hashanah and Erev Yom Kippur, symbolizing our wishes for a sweet year.

3 eggs 1 pound honey ( $1\frac{1}{3}$  cups) 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cups sugar 1 cup strong coffee 2 tsp. baking powder 3 tbsp. margarine 1 tsp. baking soda 4 cups flour 1 tsp. cinnamon

Preheat oven to 325°. Grease and flour a 9" x 13" pan. Beat eggs and honey together. Add sugar and mix again. Mix coffee with baking powder, and then add with margarine to the egg mixture. Add baking

soda, flour, cinnamon and beat together well. Bake in greased 9" x 13" pan at 325° for 55 minutes to an hour.

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#### FANCY KREPLACH

Kreplach, a chopped meat or chicken mixture encased in dough and then cooked or fried, is traditionally served the afternoon before Yom Kippur, on Hoshana Rabbah and at the Purim feast.

Dough: 2 cups flour 1/2 tsp. salt 3 tbsp. oil



2 egg yolks 1/2 cup water 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsps. baking powder or baking soda

Fillina:

1 onion, diced

- 2 tbsp. oil 1 cup ground cooked meat or chicken
- 1 tsp. salt
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp. pepper
- 1 egg
- 1 tbsp. matzoh meal

**DOUGH:** Combine flour, salt and oil. In a separate bowl, beat egg yolks, water and baking powder (or soda). Add to flour mixture. Knead and roll out, thinly, on floured surface. Cut into 3-inch squares or circles.

FILLING: Saute onion in oil. Add chopped meat and brown for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and cool. Add salt, pepper, egg and matzo meal, and mix well. Fill center of each square or circle with meat mixture. Fold into triangles, or bring both sides and bottom together towards center, pinching together and thus forming a triangle. Place in lightly salted boiling water for approximately 20 minutes until kreplach float to top. When ready, remove from pot and serve in soup. Can also be served as side dish. For firmer kreplach, fry in heated oil in skillet over medium flame until golden brown on both sides.

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### HOLIDAY RECIPES

#### HAMANTASCHEN

Hamantaschen, a traditional Purim delight, is a threecornered pastry filled with mohn (poppy seed) or other sweet filling.

1 cup sugar ⅓ cup oil <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup shortening 3 eggs <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup orange juice 4 cups flour 3 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. salt 1 egg, beaten



2 pounds mohn filling Cream sugar, oil and shortening. Add eggs and juice and mix well. Blend with dry ingredients and roll into a ball. Divide into four parts. Roll out each piece very thin

(approximately 1/8 inch) on a floured board. With the rim of a cup or glass (depending on desired size) cut into the dough to make circles. Place 1/2 to 2/3 teaspoon of filling in the middle of each circle.

To shape into triangle, lift up right and left sides, leaving the bottom side down, and bring both sides to meet at center, above the filling. Lift bottom side up to center to meet other two sides.

Preheat oven to 350°. Brush dough with beaten egg before baking. Place on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350° for approximately 20 minutes. Yields 4 dozen Hamantaschen.

#### **POTATO LATKES**

Because of the great significance of oil in the history of Chanukah, Latkes-fritters fried in oil-are usually served.

5 large potatoes, peeled 1 large onion 4 eggs <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup matzah meal 1 tsp. salt 1/4 tsp. pepper <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup oil for frying

Grate potatoes and onion on the fine side of a grater, or in food processor, or in blender with a little water added to it. Add eggs and mix well. Add matzah meal and seasoning, and mix well. Heat oil in frying pan, then add mixture, 1 tablespoon at a time, into frying pan. When golden brown, turn over and brown other side.

#### **CHEESE BLINTZES**

Cheese blintzes are served hot, with sour cream or applesauce. They are a special favorite on Shavuot, when it is customary to eat dairy products (not hard cheese) before the main lunch meal.

Batter:

4 eggs 1 cup milk 1 cup flour 1 tbsp. sour cream <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup sugar 1 tsp. vanilla extract Pinch of salt

Filling: 16 ounces cottage cheese 2 egg volks 2 tbsp. margarine or butter, melted 2 tbsp. sugar 1 tsp. vanilla extract <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup raisins (optional) <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup oil for frying

BATTER: Combine eggs and milk. Add sour cream and blend well. Add flour gradually. Mix well until batter is smooth. Heat a small amount of oil in an 8-inch frying pan, on a low flame, until hot but not smoking. Ladle a small amount of batter (approximately 1 ounce) into pan, tipping pan in all directions until batter covers the entire bottom of the pan. Fry on one side until set and golden, approximately 1 minute. Slip pancake out of pan and repeat until all batter is used. Add oil to pan as necessary.

FILLING: In another bowl, mix all ingredients for filling.

**ASSEMBLE:** Fill each pancake on golden side with 3 tbsp. of filling. Fold in sides to center and roll blintz until completely closed. Replace rolled blintzes in pan and fry for 2 minutes, turning once.

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THE ART OF MAKING STUFFED CABBAGE Traditionally served on Simchat Torah, as the

rolled cabbage reminds us of the Torah scrolls.

#### **Preparing Cabbage for Stuffing:**

Place cabbage in the freezer and leave there for 2 to 3 days. Remove and allow to defrost overnight. Cabbage rolls can be made in the morning. When cabbage has defrosted, cabbage leaves are limp. Remove leaves carefully, lifting each one separately and tearing off at bottom. Leaves come out very large this way. Rinse out individual leaves well so as to remove any insects.

#### **Rolling Cabbage with Meat Filling:**

Place a spoonful of chopped meat mixture on the rib of each leaf. Roll cabbage leaf along its length. When you are nearly finished rolling it, tuck in both outer ends and continue rolling. Cabbage leaves will remain neatly rolled up if they are stuffed while they are still warm.

Note: Using the leaves that are too small to roll, by lining the pan with them, and then placing another layer on top of the rolled cabbage in the pot enhances the flavor of the dish.



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#### **COMPANY STUFFED CABBAGE**

1 medium cabbage

Sauce: 2 tbsp. margarine 2 onions, sliced 3 cups canned tomatoes, with juice 1½ tsp. salt <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp. pepper Beef bones (optional)

1 pound chopped meat 4 tbsp. uncooked rice 4 tbsp. grated onion 1 egg 3 tbsp. cold water Seasoning 3 tbsp. honey <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup lemon juice <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup seedless raisins

Meat:

**SAUCE**: Heat margarine in 6-guart pot and saute onions. Add tomatoes, salt, pepper and bones. Cook for 30 minutes.

**MEAT:** In a bowl combine meat, rice, onion, egg and water. Place one large tablespoon of mixture onto each leaf and roll as described above.

**TO COOK:** Place cabbage rolls in sauce. Cover and cook for 11/2 hours over low heat. Sauce should cover at least half of the rolls. If more sauce is necessary, add 1 cup tomato juice.

After 1½ hours add honey, lemon juice and raisins.

Note: Stuffed cabbage freezes well. When reheating defrosted stuffed cabbage, 6 potatoes cut in quarters may be added. Cook until potatoes are tender.

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#### **OUR ARTISTS**

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#### ADAR 3

Dedication of the Second Temple in Jerusalem in 349 BCE.

#### ADAR 7

Moses, teacher of all Israel, was born on this day (1393 BCE), and passed away on Shabbat afternoon of the same date 120 years later (1273 BCE). The day before he passed away, he finished writing 13 Torah scrolls, one for each of the tribes of Israel, and one for the Levites to place next to the Holy Ark in the Holy of Holies (inner sanctum) of the Mishkan (desert Sanctuary).

The last eight verses of the Torah (Deuteronomy 34:5-12) describe his passing away and subsequent events. One Talmudic opinion is that they were written by Joshua, his successor. Another is that Moses himself wrote them, at G-d's dictation, in tears.

When Haman, Grand Vizier of Achashverosh, sought an auspicious time to destroy all Jews in all 127 provinces of the Persian realm, he picked Adar, the month when Moses, the Jews' greatest leader ever, passed away. He also drew lots ("Purim"), and the lot, too, fell on this month. What he did not realize was that in this month Moses was also born, and it was therefore a most fortunate time for the Jews! (Talmud)

ADAR 13 | FAST OF ESTHER

The Fast of Esther is held on the day preceding Purim,

when the Jewish people were saved from total annihilation. This date was chosen by Haman to annihilate all Jews in all 127 provinces of the Persian Empire, with the permission of King Achashverosh. Queen Esther thwarted his plan and received the king's permission for the Jews to resist. However, they were still in mortal danger, and therefore forbidden by Jewish law to fast (for the purpose of arousing Divine mercy) on that day, so as not to weaken themselves when they might have to fight for their lives. The only member of the Jewish People who was certainly safe was Queen Esther herself. Therefore only she fasted, which is why the fast is called by her name.

#### ADAR 14 | PURIM

Purim commemorates the day when Jews throughout the Persian Empire were miraculously saved, and rested from fighting their enemies on the previous day, having totally routed them.

#### HOW TO CELEBRATE PURIM

#### Listen to the Megillah

To relive the miraculous events of Purim, we listen to the reading of the Megillah (the Scroll of Esther) on Wednesday night, March 16, and again during the daytime of Thursday, March 17. When Haman's name is mentioned, we twirl graggers and stamp our feet to "drown out" his evil name. Tell the children that Purim is the only time when it's a mitzvah to make noise!

#### Send Gifts of Food

On Purim we emphasize the importance of Jewish unity and friendship by sending gifts of food to friends. Send a gift of at least two kinds of ready-to-eat foods (for example, pastry, fruit, beverage) to at least one friend on March 17, during the daytime. It is proper that men send to men, and women to women. Sending these gifts should be done through a third party. Children, in addition to sending their own gifts of food, make enthusiastic messengers.

#### Give Gifts to the Needy

Concern for the needy is a year-round responsibility for the Jew. On Purim, particularly, it is a special mitzvah to remember the poor. Give charity to at least two—but preferably more—needy individuals on March 17, during the daytime. The mitzvah is best fulfilled by giving directly to the needy. If, however, you cannot find poor people, place at least several coins into pushkas (charity boxes). Even small children should fulfill this mitzvah.

#### **Eat the Festive Meal**

As on all festivals, we celebrate Purim with a special festive meal on March 17, during the daytime, when family and friends gather together to rejoice in the Purim spirit.

#### Machatzit Hashekel

When the Holy Temple stood in Jerusalem, each Jew contributed a half-shekel annually, thereby having a share in the sacrifices offered on behalf of the entire Jewish People. Today we commemorate this by giving 3 "half" coins (e.g., 3 half-dollars in the United States) to charity. This mitzvah, usually performed in the synagogue, should be done on March 16 or March 17, according to your custom.

#### ADAR 15

Shushan Purim commemorates the day when the Jews of Shushan, capital of Persia, rested from fighting their enemies, after the king granted them an extra day to finish off the job. It is observed as Purim, instead of the previous day, in all cities surrounded by a wall since the time of Joshua, such as Jerusalem. Elsewhere it is celebrated as a minor holiday.

#### A JOYOUS PURIM!

#### PARAH ADUMAH - THE RED HEIFER

On the 2nd of Nissan, one day after the inauguration of the Tabernacle, Moses prepared the very first Red Heifer, in order to ritually purify the Jewish nation in preparation for the bringing of the Paschal Lamb in the newly erected Sanctuary.

There were nine Red Heifers brought from the first one, in the time of Moses, until the destruction of the Second Temple. A tenth Red Heifer will be brought by Moshiach, may he come quickly in our days.

Each year on a Shabbat preceding the month of Nissan, the Torah portion with the commandment of the Red Heifer is read.

#### HOW TO PREPARE FOR PASSOVER

#### What is Chometz?

Chometz is any food or drink made from wheat, barley, rye, oats or spelt, or their derivatives, which is forbidden on Passover because it is leavened or fermented. If a food contains any of these ingredients and is not certified as "kosher for Passover," it's considered chometz. If a food contains even a trace of chometz, we don't eat it, we don't sell it, and we make sure not to have any of it in our possession on any of the days of Passover.

(Note: Matzah used all year round is not for Passover use. Only matzahs baked especially for Passover may be used on Passover.)

#### **Cleaning for Passover**

Take all the chometz—both food and utensils used throughout the year (and not koshered for Passover)—and store it all away in closets or rooms that you will lock or tape shut. You'll sell this chometz temporarily to a non-Jew.

Clean your entire house, purging it of all crumbs and small pieces of food. Also check for chometz in your car and office—don't overlook desks and drawers.

#### How to Prepare the Kitchen

Since the kitchen has been used the whole year long for chometz, it's going to need some work to prepare it for Passover use. Contact us for details.

#### **Shopping for Passover**

While shopping for Passover, we must be careful that the foods we buy are not only kosher but are also kosher-for-Passover—that is, completely chometz-free.

In addition to raw ingredients, there are many kosher-for-Passover packaged foods available. However, be careful to purchase only those packaged foods that display the insignia of a reliable supervising agency, together with "P" or "kosher for Passover."

Obviously, all leavened foods such as bread and cake made from wheat, barley, rye, oats or spelt are actual chometz and are prohibited on Passover. Examples are breakfast cereals, licorice, most candy bars, pasta, vinegar, beer and whiskey.

#### How to Sell the Chometz

Since we can't own chometz on Passover, we need to sell to a non-Jew, before the time indicated on the calendar, all chometz that we will not consume or destroy before Passover. This is not a simple transaction. That is why we empower a competent Rabbi to do it for us.

#### Search for Chometz

On the evening of April 14 we search our homes for chometz.

#### The Morning Before Passover

On April 15 we may eat chometz only until the time indicated on the calendar. After that time we may eat only foods which are kosher-for-Passover. However, we do not eat matzah until the Seder.

#### **Burning the Chometz**

On the morning of April 15 we burn the chometz that was found during the search, and all other chometz that is not stored away to be sold to the non-Jew.

#### NISSAN 15-16 | THE SEDER NIGHTS

The first two nights of Passover we conduct a Seder—a festive yet solemn event. At a table royally set with our best crystal and silver and the finest of kosher wines, we re-enact the Exodus from Egypt in ancient times. We also pray for the forthcoming redemption speedily in our days.


At the Seder, each person considers himself as if he was going out of Egypt. We are with our people as they descend into exile and suffer cruel oppression. We are with them when G-d sends the Ten Plagues to punish Pharaoh and his nation, with them as they leave Egypt, and with them at the crossing of the Red Sea.

#### Second Night of Pesach

On the second night of Pesach (April 16), we begin Sefirat Ha'omer, the counting of the 49 days between Pesach and Shavuot.

#### **NISSAN 22: LAST DAY OF PASSOVER**

The eighth day of Passover is traditionally associated with our fervent hope for the coming of Moshiach.




The Baal Shem Tov, founder of Chassidus, instituted the custom of eating a special third meal on the last day of Passover, complete with matzah and wine, called the "Meal of Moshiach."

On that day, he said, one can feel the approach of Moshiach.

Passover does not end until the night of April 23, at the time indicated on the calendar. Until approximately an hour after that time, no chometz should be bought or eaten.

#### SEFIRAT HA'OMER | COUNTING OF THE OMER

The festivals of Pesach and Shavuot are linked: Pesach marks our physical liberation (the Exodus from Egypt and the birth of the Jewish nation), and on Shavuot we received the Torah—the spiritual essence and liberation of the Jewish people. To note this link, we count every one of the forty-nine days between these two festivals. This counting, called Sefirat Ha'omer, expresses our eager anticipation of receiving the Torah.

The counting begins on the second night of Pesach, immediately after nightfall, and is continued every subsequent evening (after nightfall).

#### **CHAPTERS OF THE FATHERS**

It is customary to study one chapter of Mishnah, Tractate Avot (Chapters of the Fathers), on each Shabbat between Pesach and Shavuot after Minchah, thus completing the whole tractate before Shavuot. (Some continue this study until the end of Elul.) The Second Passover. The year after the Exodus, G-d commanded the Jewish People to celebrate Passover in the desert. #### IYAR 2

Birthday of Rabbi Shmuel (1834–1882), known as the Rebbe MaHaRaSH, fourth leader of Chabad-Lubavitch.

#### **TORAH STUDY**

Torah is the medium of communication through which G-d enables man to know, serve and connect to Him. The campaign for Torah study encourages every individual to set fixed times for Torah study every day, so that our spiritual growth and development can be systematic and directed. Since the giving of the Torah at Sinai, Torah study has been an integral part of of Jewish life. Rabbi Shneur Zalman of Liadi explained that Torah study should be fixed not only in time but also in soul. It should be the hub around which the entire spectrum of our day-to-day experience revolves.

The Talmud tells the story of when the Roman government issued a decree forbidding Torah study. Papus ben Yehudah saw Rabbi Akiva conducting Torah classes and asked him, "Do you not fear punishment by the law?" Rabbi Akiva answered with a parable: A fox was strolling along the riverbank and noticed fish swimming swiftly from place to place. He asked, "Why are you running?" They replied, "We are afraid of the net that people set up to catch us." The fox slyly said, "Perhaps it would be wise to ascend to the shore and live together with me as my parents lived with your parents." The fish responded, "You speak foolishly. If we are afraid in our native habitat, our fear will be even greater on land, where death will be certain." Similarly, Torah is our source of life, and may save us. Without it we will definitely perish (Berachot 61b).

#### IYAR 10

Eli, high priest and judge (ruler) of the Jewish People before Samuel, died at Shiloh at the age of 98 from shock (890 BCE), on hearing how the Philistines had captured the Holy Ark and slaughtered 30,000 Israelites, including his two sons (I Samuel 4:10–18).

Rabbi Yitzchak al-Fasi, known as RIF (1013–1103), author of a fundamental code of Jewish law based on the Talmud, and itself the basis for the later authoritative codes of RaMBaM and Shulchan Aruch, passed away in Lucena, Spain. (Some record the anniversary as Nissan 10, others as Iyar 11.)

#### IYAR 14 | PESACH SHENI

The Second Passover. The year after the Exodus, G-d commanded the Jewish People to celebrate Passover in the desert. However, some complained that they had become ritually impure and would not be able to purify themselves in time to offer their Passover sacrifice. G-d told Moses they would get a second chance to offer their sacrifice on Iyar 14 (a month after Nissan 14, when the Passover sacrifice is normally brought). This applied until the cessation of sacrifices with the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 CE. Many still have a custom of celebrating the day by eating matzah.

#### IYAR 18 | LAG B'OMER

The 33rd day of the Omer counting is celebrated as a holiday. Two reasons: 1) Between Passover and Shavuot, one year in the early 2nd century, 24,000 disciples of Rabbi Akiva (greatest Sage of Israel in the Mishnaic period) passed away because they were not respectful enough to each other. Therefore, this period is a time of semi-mourning (no weddings, etc.). On the 33rd (LaG = 33) day of the Omer, they stopped dying. 2) An outstanding later disciple of Rabbi Akiva, Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai, Mishnaic Sage and author of the Zohar, principal work of Jewish mysticism (Kabbalah), passed away. Having fulfilled his mission in this world, he asked that the anniversary be celebrated as a happy day.



Children have a custom to play with bows and arrows, and are taken on trips to parks or the countryside. There is a widespread custom to light bonfires the previous night.

#### **IYAR 28**

Samuel the Prophet, last judge of Israel before the first king, Saul, was anointed, passed away at the age of 52 (880 BCE), and was mourned by the whole nation (I Samuel 25:1). He is buried near Jerusalem.

#### SIVAN 1

The Jewish People arrived on this day (1313 BCE) at Mount Sinai, united in their readiness to receive G-d's Torah (Exodus 19:1-2).

#### SIVAN 2

Moses ascended Mt. Sinai. G-d told him to tell first the women, then the men, that He had selected them to be His Chosen Nation, "a kingdom of princes and a holy people" (Exodus 19:3–6).

#### SIVAN 3-5

Three days of spiritual preparation for receiving the Torah, including formal conversion through immersion in a mikveh (ritual pool) and acceptance of mitzvot (Exodus 19:12, 24:7).

#### SIVAN 6-7 | SHAVUOT

Shavuot is a major festival, celebrating an event so important that the world would be an entirely different place without it. 3,334 years ago on this day, the entire Jewish nation stood at the foot of Mount Sinai, and the transmission of Torah from heaven to earth began.

Torah was the first mindset to recognize the worth of ordinary people who were not kings and bullies. To champion human rights, public education, environmental responsibility, freedom of information, medical ethics, feminism, social action, and the whole concept of progress and hope for the future. No other teaching has had a comparable impact on our way of thinking today. Much of what Torah teaches us remains radical even in modern terms.

The literal meaning of the word Torah is "instructions." The same Manufacturer who produced the world provides instructions on what to do with it. Every story of the Torah is a lesson in life with a myriad of applications. Nothing it contains is irrelevant or anachronistic, because the Torah is eternal wisdom, beyond space and time. In fact, our Sages say, Torah is the blueprint by which the world was designed.

#### SHAVUOT OBSERVANCES

On the first night of Shavuot many communities host an all-night learnathon. The next morning, June 5, every man, woman and child attends services to hear the Ten Commandments read from a Torah scroll. It is especially important for children to be there, since they served as our guarantors the first time the Torah was given.

Before the main meat meal on the first day of Shavuot, the tradition is to eat a festive dairy meal (not hard cheese). Cheesecake is a big hit. Some have the custom on Shavuot to decorate their synagogues and homes with flowers, fruits and greens. King David passed away on Shavuot. So did the father of the Chassidic movement, Rabbi Yisroel Baal Shem Tov.

Shavuot is an opportune time to fix a daily time for Torah study.

#### SIVAN 20

The entire Jewish community of Blois, France, was burnt to death in 1171. They sang the "Aleinu" prayer as they died, affirming their faith in G-d rather than saving their lives by converting.

During the Cossack massacres led by Bogdan Chmielnicki in 1648–49, hundreds of thousands of Jews were cruelly slaughtered, hundreds of Jewish communities were wiped out, and two-thirds of Polish Jewry decimated.


One of the largest massacres, of 12,000 Jews, was at Nemirov on Sivan 20. For hundreds of years this day was observed as a public fast day, proclaimed by the Torah leaders in memory of the two-year ordeal which left thousands orphaned and widowed, and which impoverished the entire Jewish community.

#### THE WRITTEN AND THE ORAL TORAH

Iln its most specific sense, Torah refers to the Five Books of Moses, written down over a period of 40 years by Moses while he and his people roamed the Sinai Desert. Unlike other prophets, Moses writes in the third person, describing events as though he were a passive observer. This is because Moses was no more than a clear conduit, allowing G-d's wisdom to flow into the world with no interference from his own ego.

In a more general sense, Torah includes all the 24 books of the Bible. Even more generally, Torah includes the oral traditions, writings and sayings of all Torah Sages throughout the generations. As the Rabbis taught, any idea a sharp student will come up with in the future was also given to Moses at Sinai—even if Moses himself was not aware of it when he received it.

Moses didn't just write a scroll, he also explained its meaning. That explanation was passed down with precision through an unbroken chain of tradition, until much of it was committed to writing in the Talmud. By examining peculiarities of the stories and language of the Torah, we uncover more treasures of wisdom hidden beneath the surface. Alongside this is a rich esoteric tradition called the Kabbalah, which unlocks secret knowledge we could never know on our own. These traditions, known as the Oral Torah, are just as sacred to Jews as the Written Torah.

#### **TAMMUZ 3**

Passing of the Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, in 1994. The Rebbe emphasized many times after the passing of his father-inlaw, in 1950, that the anniversary of the passing of a righteous Jewish leader is an auspicious time for us to rededicate ourselves to the realization of his most cherished goals.

The Rebbe's leadership continues to inspire us. He has taught us that with every good deed we do, we bring the world one step closer to perfection. Indeed, every kind word we speak, and even our positive thoughts, have a potent beneficial effect. By remembering the Rebbe's vision and by connecting to his purpose, we can hasten the unfolding of the final Redemption and a better life for all humankind.

#### **TAMMUZ 12-13**

Birthday of Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn (1880–1950), sixth leader of Chabad-Lubavitch.

Release of Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn from Bolshevik imprisonment in Leningrad in 1927. His imprisonment followed his implacable struggle to preserve Jewish religious life throughout the Soviet Union. Aided by his faithful followers, he established a vast underground network of Torah schools, and of financial aid for construction and upkeep of mikvaos (ritual pools for marital purity), for Shabbat observance and for the purchase of religious objects. Although the initial sentence was death, international pressure brought commutation to 10 years' hard labor in the Arctic, and then to three years' exile in the Urals. After a few days in exile, he was released on Tammuz 12-13 and, soon after, forced to leave Russia. His release was considered, under the circumstances, miraculous,

#### **TAMMUZ 17**

Moses descended from Mt. Sinai, after G-d had taught him the entire Torah for 40 days. In his hands he carried the two stone tablets engraved with the Ten Commandments. But when he saw the Jewish People worshipping the Golden Calf, he smashed the tablets.

In later generations, King Menashe set up an idol in the Temple; Apostomos (a Greek general?) burnt a Torah scroll; the daily sacrifices had to stop; and the Romans breached Jerusalem's wall (70 CE).

This day (or the following day, if it falls on Shabbat) is observed as one of the six public fast days. It begins the "Three Weeks," a period of national mourning for the destruction of the two Temples, during which we celebrate no weddings and schedule no festivities.

#### TAMMUZ 29

RaShl, Rabbi Shlomo Yitzchaki (1040-1105), most outstanding of all Bible and Talmud commentators, passed away in Troyes, France. Without his clear, concise commentary, Talmud study today would be almost impossible. His Bible commentary, too, a masterpiece of clarity and brevity, is understandable even by a five-yearold starting Chumash study. Over 200 supercommentaries have been written on it. Rashi's disciples were the first Tosafists, the renowned medieval Talmud scholars of northern France and Germany, whose analytical comments upon the Talmud are the basis of Talmudic scholarship in all succeeding generations.

#### PUT YOUR SOUL WHERE YOUR STOMACH IS

#### Food for the Soul

Just as there are foods that are good for the body and foods that are harmful, so there are foods that nourish the inner person—the soul—and foods that harm it.

The kosher laws are the Torah's guide to those foods that affect the Jewish soul adversely. Any meat or fowl that is eaten must be slaughtered in a prescribed, kosher fashion. Meat and milk must never mix. Scavengers, predatory beasts and birds, shellfish and certain other animals are forbidden. Any processed foods must be produced under strict kosher supervision.

#### Eating Is Sacred

When they talk about spirituality, people think about meditation, prayer, and maybe music. Few imagine eating as a spiritual activity. But according to the Torah, everything a person does is another way to infuse the world with spiritual meaning. Especially eating. When a person eats food with the proper mindfulness and uses the energy of that food for good things, the food becomes elevated through his eating.


That's another reason for the kosher guidelines. Kosher foods are those that a Jewish soul is able to elevate. Non-kosher foods are those that will only drag the soul down. When enough people are busy elevating the world rather than being dragged down by it, the world is able to reach its fulfillment, the time described by the prophets as the Era of Moshiach.



#### AV 9 | TISHA B'AV

Saddest day in the Jewish calendar. Commemorated as a 25-hour fast, beginning at sunset of the previous evening. (If it falls on Shabbat, it is postponed to the next day.)

Anniversary of the Divine decree that the Jewish People remain in the desert for 40 years, until that generation died out, after they cried over the 10 spies' false report about the Land of Israel.

Anniversary of the destruction (by the Babylonians under Nebuchadnezzar) of the First Temple (423 BCE), and (by the Romans under Titus) of the Second Temple (70 CE).

Capture by Romans of Beitar, last Jewish fortress to hold out in the Bar Kochba rebellion, with terrible loss of life (c. 135 CE). Jerusalem was ploughed up and turned into a non-Jewish city, Aelia Capitolina (c. 135 CE).

In 1492, Av 9 was the last day by which all Jews who would not be baptized had to leave Spain. Over 300,000 chose to leave, suffering terrible privations till they found stable new places of abode. Many never made it, victims of pirates, unscrupulous ship captains, robbers and starvation. Of those who succumbed and converted in order to remain in Spain, many secretly retained their Jewish identity for generations. They were known as Marranos. But many were caught by the Inquisition's watchful eye and burnt at the stake.

World War I, too, began on Av 9. It uprooted large Jewish populations and threw most Jewish communities into chaos. It brought in its wake the Russian Revolution, which systematically crushed Judaism; the Cossack massacres of Jews throughout the Ukraine (1918–1921); and the conditions which gave rise to Nazism and the Holocaust.

#### AV 15

Anniversary of several happy events: the end of the 40year decree that the Jewish People remain in the desert; the reconciliation of the tribe of Benjamin with the other tribes of Israel; the removal of the guards stationed by Jeroboam ben Nevat to prevent pilgrimages of the Ten Tribes of Israel to the Temple in Jerusalem; and the grant of Roman permission to bury the dead of Beitar, after 14 years. "There were no greater holidays for the Jewish People than Av 15 and Yom Kippur."

#### AV 20

Rabbi Levi Yitzchak Schneerson, renowned scholar and Kabbalist, and father of the Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Schneerson, passed away (1944).

#### MOSHIACH-OUR REDEEMER

"I believe with complete faith in the coming of Moshiach. And though he may tarry, I shall wait, anticipating his arrival each day." (Number 12 of Maimonides' 13 Principles of Faith)

#### Belief in Moshiach is Central to Judaism

The concept of Moshiach is basic to Jewish belief. It is found in the writings of the prophets, which are filled with references to Moshiach. Throughout history our ancestors have prayed for Moshiach's arrival.

In the Messianic Era, the Divine plan for the world will be fully realized. There will be universal peace, prosperity, goodness and knowledge of G-d.

#### How Will Moshiach Affect Our Lives?


The coming of Moshiach will not cause a break with the past and the beginning of something entirely new. On the contrary, it is the culmination and crowning stroke of all our efforts toward a world of peace and consummate holiness.

#### THE MONTH OF ELUL

One of the major accusations often leveled at the CEO of the universe is inaccessibility. These charges are entirely unfounded.

G-d is everywhere, and from there He awaits your call. And just to prove it, one month before Rosh Hashanah, He devotes an entire month to being as approachable as an Almighty Creator can get.

Think of it as though the big boss took a stroll through the cubicles, happily chatting with anyone who approaches, giving each his full attention and a warm smile. That is what our Sages mean when they call Elul the Month of Divine Compassion. During these days, you can repair all that went amiss from the entire year-with study, with charity and good deeds, with meditation and prayer. That is also why we blow the Shofar every day of this month (except Shabbat), as a wake-up call to prepare for the magnificent days to come. We also have our Tefillin and Mezuzot checked during this month.

#### **ELUL 18**

Birthday of Rabbi Yisrael Baal Shem Tov (1698–1760), founder of Chassidism, renowned for his love of every Jew. Birthday of Rabbi Shneur Zalman of Liadi (1745–1812), known as the Alter Rebbe, founder of the Chabad-Lubavitch intellectual branch of Chassidism, author of Tanya and Shulchan Aruch HaRav.

#### **ELUL 22**

First day, this year, for saying Selichot, "prayers for forgiveness." The first Selichot are said early Sunday morning after midnight (about 1:00 a.m. when Daylight Saving Time is in effect). The other Selichot are said before dawn or in the early morning.

#### **ELUL 25**

First day of Creation, according to one Talmudic opinion. Rosh Hashanah is the sixth day, when Man was created.

#### TISHREI 1-2 | ROSH HASHANAH

Rosh Hashanah literally means "Head of the Year." Imagine the year as a body and Rosh Hashanah as its brain, containing all the switches for every day of the year. That's also why it is the Day of Judgment: Every moment of these 48 hours, our words and actions adjust the program for another day of the year.

On the first evening of Rosh Hashanah, we bless one another, saying, "May you be signed and sealed in the Book of Life!" This Book of Life is not written on paper, but programmed into the natural order of things. Over the period of ten days until Yom Kippur, the code can still be revised by revising our own hearts and lives. After that, it is burned in. Rewrites are awkward.

#### The Shofar

There is one mitzvah, the core mitzvah of this day, that sums up all that Rosh Hashanah is about. It is to hear the sound of a Shofar blown thirty times in the sequence written in the prayerbook.

A Shofar is not a trumpet or a French horn; it is a plain horn of an animal. We don't play a symphony or a sonata, just a raw and simple cry. Our Sages say it is the sound of a small child crying for his father. If you listen carefully, you can hear that cry inside as well, a simple, primal cry as each soul yearns to return to its essential Father on this day. We hear the sounding of the Shofar on both days of Rosh Hashanah, Sept. 26 and 27, during the daytime.

#### Tashlich

A beautiful and ancient custom observed in most communities, full of symbolism and drama. On the second day of Rosh Hashanah we walk to a body of water containing live fish and recite Tashlich, a prayer that G-d, out of His great compassion, will toss our sins into the sea. The fish, too, take part in the metaphor: Just as fish never close their eyes, so is G-d everwatchful over us.


#### **TISHREI 3 | FAST OF GEDALIAH**

This fast day commemorates the tragic assassination of Gedaliah, a great Jewish leader during the Babylonian exile.

#### **TEN DAYS OF TESHUVAH**

The Ten Days of Teshuvah extend from Rosh Hashanah to Yom Kippur. Teshuvah is often translated as "repentance," but that's misleading. Its true meaning is return. There is a world of difference: Repentance means you were bad and now you have resolved to be good.

But the true you is never bad; the true you is a G-dly soul. Only, perhaps, certain behaviors and attitudes may have gone a little awry. You need only to return to that essential self and to that which is rightfully yours. During these days, that return is much easier than at any other time of year.
